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# **Summary of Key Points**

#### **Overview**

This report contains information from the latest (2022/23) Revenue Outturn returns on the level of sales, fees and charges for your authority as a proportion of total service expenditure. This is referred to as the income-toexpenditure ratio. The report can act as an initial guide for further investigation into areas where this ratio appears inconsistent with similar authorities.\*

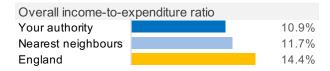

#### **Overall Sales, Fees and Charges**

In 2022/23, Newtimber's income-to-expenditure ratio was 10.9%, lower than both the nearest neighbour average (of 11.7%) and the England average (14.4%).



 Newtimber's ratio was ranked 10th highest out of 16 nearest neighbours, and 100th highest out of 125 comparable authorities in England.

Between 2021/22 and 2022/23, your authority's total sales, fees & charges increased by 4.9%.

# 1. Methodology

This report assesses sales, fees and charges as a percentage of authorities' total expenditure (excluding capital charges). For simplicity, this is also referred to as the **income-to-expenditure ratio**.

Data is taken from the Revenue Outturn (RO) forms for 2022/23. The data only includes 'sales, fees and charges', and excludes 'other income'. Figures exclude schools and emergency services.

Negative sales, fees and charges figures, as reported in the RO forms, are treated as zero (£0) for the purpose of calculating income-to-expenditure ratios.

# 2. Comparator groups

## Nearest neighbour group

Please note that some authorities did not submit expenditure outturn (RO) data for 2022/23. In cases where data is missing for your authority's nearest neighbours, these have been replaced by the next closest authorities from LG Futures' nearest neighbour model.

To enable a like-for-like comparison, this analysis makes use of LG Futures' statistical 'nearest neighbour' groups. These identify councils with similar economic and social characteristics and groups them on a statistical basis. These groupings were last updated for the 2023/24 subscription.

#### National comparator group

At the national level, comparisons are made between authorities that provide broadly similar services. Authorities are grouped based on whether they provide (1) both upper-tier and lower-tier services, (2) exclusively upper-tier services, or (3) exclusively lower-tier services.

Based on the services it provides, Newtimber falls into Group 1, as shown in the table below. All national comparisons in this report are made with reference to this group of councils. In 2022/23, data was available for 125 of these authorities.

# 3. Potential revenue gains / losses

This section considers the *notional* gain or loss in revenue that would result from setting your authority's income-to-expenditure ratio to certain levels relative to other councils.

Benchmarks are set relative to Newtimber's nearest neighbour group.

Benchmark ratios are the cut-off point for the top 20% of authorities, the top 40% of authorities, the median, the bottom 40% of authorities, and the bottom 20%.

It is estimated that setting Newtimber's income-to-expenditure ratios to the top 20% of its nearest neighbours would result in notional revenue gains of £17.5m. This is shown in the table below. Notional gains are greatest for Adult Social Care (£6.0m).

# 4. Overview of total sales, fees and charges

# Sources of sales, fees and charges

In 2022/23, Newtimber received income from sales, fees and charges worth £62.118m.

The table below shows the composition of this income, and how it compares to the nearest neighbour and England averages.

## Past changes in sales, fees and charges

This section examines historical changes in sales, fees and charges. To enable like-for-like comparisons, both across authorities and between years, we only examine **core services**, which **excludes** income from schools, emergency services and public health.

Between 2021/22 and 2022/23, your authority's income from core services increased by £2.911m, or 4.9%. This compares to a nearest neighbour group increase of 7.8%, and national increase of 8.9%.

The following charts show how the level and composition of core income has changed since 2017/18. These changes have not been adjusted for inflation, or any changes in functions or responsibilities.

Please note that where spending data for a specific financial year is unavailable, the charts automatically set the value to 0 with respect to the missing information.

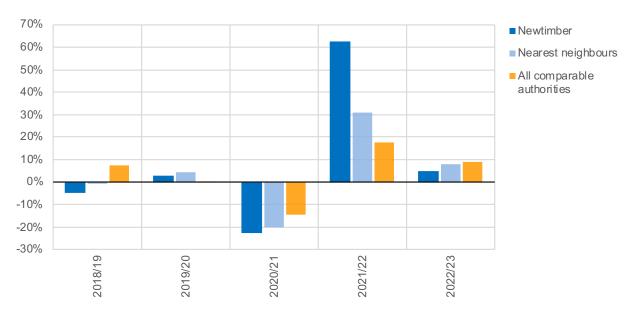
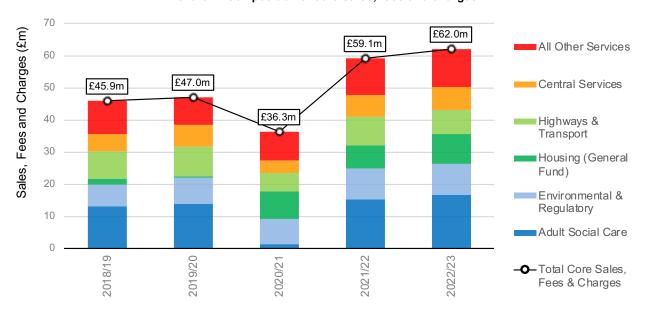


Chart 2 - Composition of core sales, fees and charges\*

## Sales, fees and charges relative to expenditure

In 2022/23, your authority had an income-to-expenditure ratio of 10.9%. The derivation of this figure is shown in Table 5.

The ratio for Newtimber was lower than the nearest neighbour average of 11.7%. It was ranked 10th highest in the group, as illustrated below.

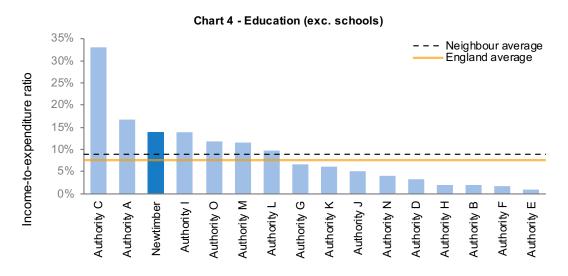

#### Education

For Education (exc. schools), your authority's income-to-expenditure ratio was 14.0%. This was higher than the nearest neighbour average of 8.9%, and ranked 3rd highest in the group, as illustrated below.



Your authority's ratio was higher than the England average of 7.6%. Its ratio was ranked 18th highest out of 125 comparable authorities across England.

A detailed breakdown of sales, fees and charges for this service is provided below. The services 'post-16 provision' and 'other education & community' are considered to be non-school expenditure.

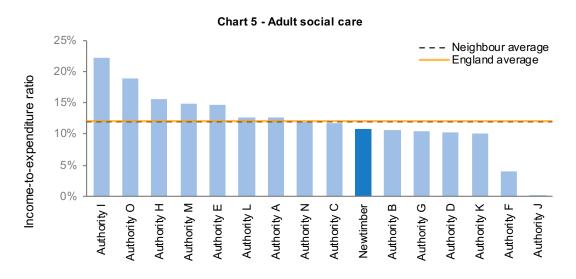

#### **Adult Social Care**

For Adult Social Care, your authority's income-to-expenditure ratio was 10.9%. This was lower than the nearest neighbour average of 12.0%, and ranked 10th highest in the group, as illustrated below.



Your authority's ratio was lower than the England average of 12.1%. Its ratio was ranked 79th highest out of 125 comparable authorities across England.

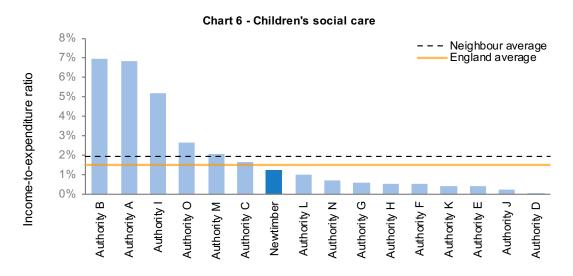

#### Children's Social Care

For Children's Social Care, your authority's income-to-expenditure ratio was 1.2%. This was lower than the nearest neighbour average of 1.9%, and ranked 7th highest in the group, as illustrated below.



Your authority's ratio was lower than the England average of 1.5%. Its ratio was ranked 45th highest out of 125 comparable authorities across England.

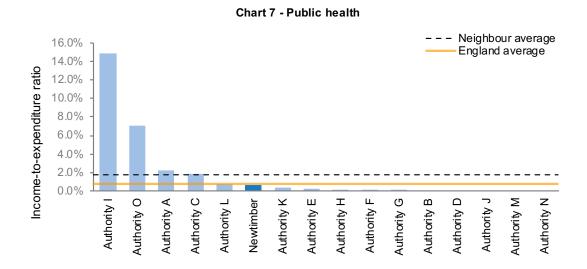

#### **Public Health**

For Public Health, your authority's income-to-expenditure ratio was 0.5%. This was lower than the nearest neighbour average of 1.7%, and ranked 6th highest in the group, as illustrated below.



Your authority's ratio was lower than the England average of 0.8%. Its ratio was ranked 28th highest out of 125 comparable authorities across England. Please note that 61 unitary authorities recorded an overall 0% ratio for public health, which will skew the ranking values.

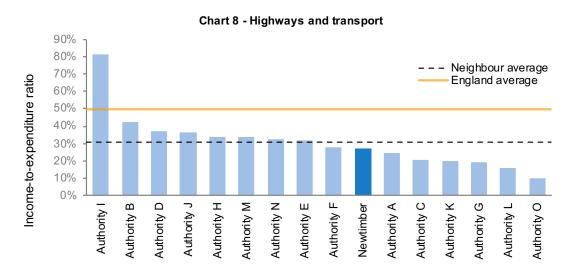

## Highways and Transport

For Highways & Transport, your authority's income-to-expenditure ratio was 26.8%. This was lower than the nearest neighbour average of 30.7%, and ranked 10th highest in the group, as illustrated below.



Your authority's ratio was lower than the England average of 49.7%. Its ratio was ranked 97th highest out of 125 comparable authorities across England.

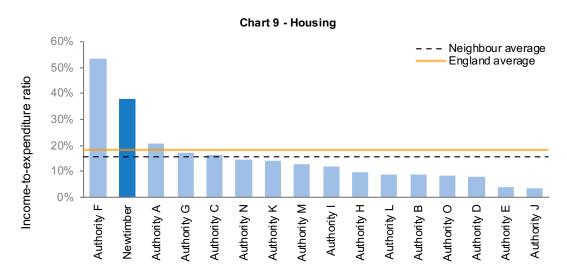

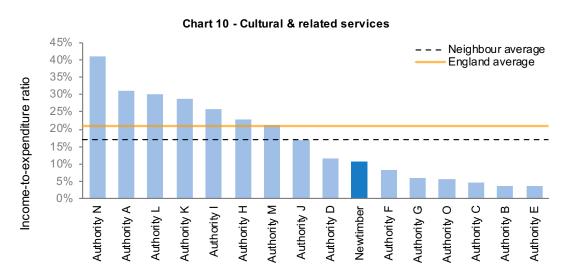

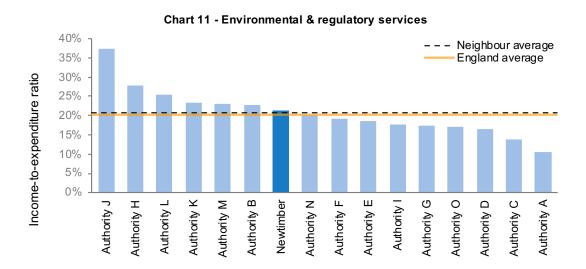

## **Environmental and Regulatory Services**

For Environmental & Regulatory, your authority's income-to-expenditure ratio was 21.3%. This was higher than the nearest neighbour average of 20.7%, and ranked 7th highest in the group, as illustrated below.



Your authority's ratio was higher than the England average of 20.2%. Its ratio was ranked 53rd highest out of 125 comparable authorities across England.

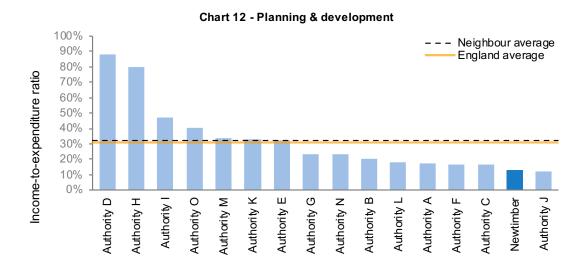

For Planning & Development, your authority's income-to-expenditure ratio was 12.9%. This was lower than the nearest neighbour average of 32.2%, and ranked 15th highest in the group, as illustrated below.



Your authority's ratio was lower than the England average of 30.9%. Its ratio was ranked 114th highest out of 125 comparable authorities across England.

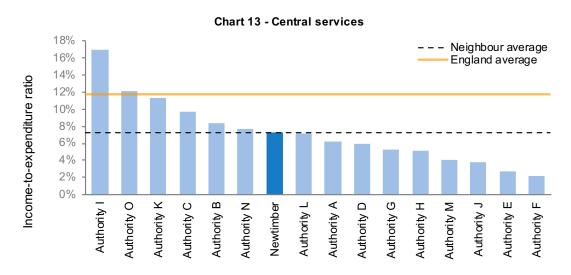
